Dear Parent/Guardian:

State Assessments provide an evaluation, or snapshot, of student performance for both content and skills in various academic areas. Along with student work on classroom assignments, projects, essays, and local assessments, state assessment results give teachers and parents important information about student paths toward academic success.

In compliance with both New Hampshire state law RSA 193-C:6 and federal accountability requirements as defined in the Every Student Succeeds Act, all public schools are required to assess students annually using a standardized assessment. The State of New Hampshire utilizes several assessments in order to comply with federal and state requirements.

Each Year, students in grades 3-8 participate in the New Hampshire Statewide Assessment System (SAS). Students in grade 11 participate in the SAS for science and the College Board School Day Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT). The Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) Assessment is available for students who meet the state participation eligibility criteria. The ACCESS test of English Language Proficiency is administered to eligible ESOL students.

Depending on his/her grade level, your student will be administered:

- Grades 3-8 (SAS or DLM)
 - English language arts/writing
 - Mathematics
 - Science (Grades 5 and 8)
- Grade 11 (College Board School Day SAT, SAS or DLM)
 - English language arts/reading/writing
 - Mathematics
 - Science

SAS testing dates and times for each school are still being finalized. Within the next few weeks, dates and times for each school will be listed in school newsletters and/or posted on the school website or in Schoology. The testing window for all the assessments spans from March 4, 2023 – June 7, 2024. Parents may access additional information and training tests for SAS by navigating to the New Hampshire portal at Students and Families (cambiumast.com). Falling within this window, the school-based SAT will be held at Goffstown High School between March 25th-April 5th.

When individual student reports are made available to districts by the state, your student's individual SAS Score Report will be available in the Family Portal provided by the NHED. Directions to access the Family Portal will be sent home from the district via School Messenger.

School Day SAT results will be available to students in early May and will be accessible in personal student SAT accounts. DLM Individual Student Reports are typically released to districts in July. The Individual Score Report will be sent home to parents shortly after the reports are released.

If you have any questions related to this assessment administration, please contact the principal at your student's school. Should you choose to exempt your student from the state assessment (permitted in RSA 193-C:6), you must submit the state approved exemption form to the principal in the school your student attends. The principal can provide you with the required form. If you choose to exempt your student from the assessment, no scores or summary of individual student performance, based on the statewide assessment, will be provided to you or your student.
